Happy New Year! I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and New Year break. On behalf of the staff and myself, I would like to thank you for your kind cards and gifts at the end of last term. I wish you a happy and peaceful 2026.

This week we celebrated the feast of the Epiphany by celebrating mass with the parish in the Church. This feast day also marked the end of the Jubilee Year of Hope. Although this special year has ended, we will continue to carry forward the spiritual gift of hope; supporting our school community to live out their faith daily, by spreading God's love and mercy to others.



Class of the week - Year 6

This week we have been busy using the wall apparatus in PE. We thought carefully about how we can use our gymnastic skills to safely explore height and movement. Using the benches, we have created our own sequences that contain a partner balance.



In English, we have been completing our learning of Ebenezer Scrooge. We have been exploring the language of Dickens and using these elements to write our own character sketch of Scrooge.

In maths, we have been busy drawing triangles with given measurements and also using protractors to measure angles accurately.



Attendance

Attendance is a high priority at our school. It is important that the children have good attendance to support their well-being, attainment and progress. The Department for Education is in support of excellent attendance in schools for all children and it is clear in Keeping Children Safe in Education that good attendance is a crucial part of safeguarding.

Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.

We know that sometimes children cannot come to school because they are really unwell, however medical advice is clear that children with mild illness will often be well enough to attend - for example if they have a cough, or cold, without a temperature. The NHS guidance [Is my child too ill for school? - NHS \(www.nhs.uk\)](https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/) is designed to support parents in their decision making about mild illness.

I also ask that whenever possible routine appointments are made for outside of school hours. All absences must be reported through the StudyBugs app or through the office before 8.55am.

The school day begins at 8.55am. Children arriving at school after this time must report to the school office and be signed in by a parent/carer; children will be marked in the register as late. Children arriving after 9.15am will be registered as an unauthorised absence—this has a direct impact on their overall attendance.

As Headteachers should only grant leave of absence in exceptional circumstances, a leave of absence will not be granted for the purposes of a family holiday. Therefore, if leave of absence is taken it will be recorded as unauthorised absence and referred to the Attendance Advisory Service where a Penalty Notice Warning may be issued.

Rewarding good and improved attendance

During our celebration assembly on the last day of Term 4 (2nd April 2026), the children who have achieved 100% attendance for the whole of Terms 3 and 4 will be entered into a raffle. This is an opportunity for those who may not have had 100% attendance during Terms 1 and 2 to improve attendance and be rewarded for that improvement. One child from each class will be drawn from the raffle and receive a Reading Vending Machine token as their prize.
