

We encourage our children to live out our school during local and wider trips, residentials and Medway Mini Youth Games, we always receive compliants regarding their behaviour and conduct; they are excellent ambassadors for our school. However, as was shared with me within one of our complaints from a local resident, our parents and carers are also representatives our school; this is mainly through the interactions at drop off and collection times. I am grateful to those parents and carers who are kind and respectful towards local residents and I am sure you are in the majority, however, sadly this is not the case with all of our parents and carers.
