Behaviour Policy Addendum

Phased return Behaviour principles

At. St. Augustine of Canterbury Catholic Primary School, we have added this behaviour policy addendum, using DfE guidance in light of the need for children to behave differently when they return to school.

The following principles will need to be followed by the children and families (where applicable) from 1^{st} June 2020.

1. Altered routines for arrival or departure.

Critical Worker or Vulnerable children in KS2 (Year 3, 4, 5, 6)	1:15pm

 All families must use the main school gate for site access. They should follow the one-way system through the staff car park to drop off and collect their child(ren) in the playground;

- Families must remain 2m away from other families during drop off and collection of children;
- Only one adult per child is permitted on the school grounds for drop off and collection;
- Parents are reminded to leave the site once their children have been safely given to them at the end of each day;
- Only one parent/quardian per child is permitted on site;
- If there are additional siblings who have no other carers at home and who are not at school they are permitted to stand with their parent/carer. They are **not** to be allowed to run around the playground or interact with other families.
- The use of scooters and/or bicycles is not permitted;
- Children will be collected in the playground by the Teacher or TA for their bubble at the agreed area for each year group;
- Parents/Guardians are NOT permitted to enter the school buildings.

2. Following school instructions on hygiene, such as handwashing and sanitising

- All occupants are required to wash their hands (soap/water or hand sanitiser) on entry to the school;
- Children must wash their hands thoroughly. Good hand washing signage to instruct children how to do this effectively is displayed;
- Help is available for children who have trouble cleaning their hands independently;
- Hand washing demonstrations have been provided to children on how to adequately wash their hands.

3. Following instructions on who pupils can socialise with at school

- Children must stay in the small group to which they are assigned;
- The class group will not interact with other groups within the school;
- When large outdoor spaces are cordoned off for use by more than one small group, children must remain in their designated area.

4. Moving around the school as per specific instructions

- Children must follow the one-way systems set up in school;
- Children must stay out of areas that have been designated as out of bounds areas;
- When queuing e.g. on arrival to enter the building, when waiting to wash their hands, when waiting to leave their designated classroom with an adult; they must do so with regard to other's space and remain as socially distant as is possible for their age and understanding;
- Children must not leave their designated classroom without permission from the adult in each area.

5. Personal hygiene expectations

- Children must, as far as possible, sneeze, cough, blow their nose into a tissue;
- Where a tissue is not immediately within their reach for sneezes and coughs, children must not cough or sneeze into their hands, but into their elbow;
- Children must dispose of used tissues into the bins following the 'catch it, bin it, kill
 it' rule;
- Children must, as far as is possible, avoid touching their mouth, nose and eyes with their hands;
- Children must not touch other's hands or faces.

6. Tell an adult if you are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus

Children must tell an adult if they feel unwell in any way, including if they have

- a high temperature;
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours;
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

Parents/carers **must** inform the school immediately if their child develops symptoms overnight or over the weekend.

7. Rules about sharing any equipment or other items

- Children must bring in their own water bottles;
- Children should bring their lunch in a disposable lunch bag;
- Children should not bring in a bag or any equipment from home;
- Children should have long lasting sun cream applied in the morning at home;
- Children will be assigned school equipment for their own use;
- Each group of children will have a designated box of play/PE equipment; this
 equipment will be cleaned before and after use by each designated class group;
- Where possible, children will have their own resources for their personal use. They should not share these items with others:
- Where any class resources are shared e.g. scooters, bikes, iPads etc. they will be wiped between uses using antibacterial wipes.

8. Amended expectations about breaks or play times

• Children will not be permitted to use the play activity centre in the playground;

- Children must stay within the designated zone in the playground or field for their scheduled break times;
- Children must not leave the designated area without adult permission or instruction.

9. Use of toilets

- Children must follow the instruction of the adults when using the toilet areas for hand washing during regular intervals throughout the day;
- Children must ask permission to use the toilet throughout the day, including during break times;
- Children must not go into the toilet area if the toilet in use sign is displayed;
- Children will not be permitted to use the middle urinal (where applicable);
- Children must flush the toilet after each use;
- Children must wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after using the toilets.

10. Coughing or spitting at or towards any other person

- Children must not intentionally, or as far as possible accidentally, cough or spit at or towards any other person;
- Any intentional coughing or spitting at or towards any other person will be classed as
 a serious breach of the school behaviour policy.

11. Home learning conduct in relation to remote education

- Where children from non-priority groups are still accessing remote learning from home they should try to implement a routine that works for personal family circumstances;
- Any work that is emailed to the teachers will be acknowledged, marked or praised as required;
- Children must follow the acceptable use agreement policy which can be found on our school website here.
