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Dear Parents and Carers,

We are looking forward to welcoming the children back on Monday. In response to some of the children feeling anxious/worried; we have shared a helpful resource through Parentmail today to support your child and provide strategies which may help them to manage their feelings.

When the children return to school next week we will continue to follow our school uniform policy (Term 4 is winter uniform). We understand that the children may have grown since December and that non-essential shops have not been open for you to purchase new uniform. If this is the case and you have not been able to purchase necessary uniform using online shopping please let us know. The children in Year 6 may wear their wonderful Leavers hoodies on the days they have PE.

As you know, this week we have celebrated our annual Book Week; the children at home and school have taken part in many activities to encourage and enhance their love of reading. We decided to postpone our 'Book Character Dress up' day to enable all of the children to take part in school together (as it is one of the most enjoyable days of our school calendar). We are of course also mindful that with the Lockdown Restrictions including the closure of non-essential shops, we did not want to put undue pressure on parents or carers to buy or make a costume during this time. Next week is 'Science Week' which has been planned to be a fun and engaging week for the children.
