The Artsmark award is the only creative quality standard for schools and education settings, accredited by Arts Council England. Rainforest with Artist John Dyer.




The Crest Award is a nationally recognised scheme for student-led project work in the STEAM subjects (science, technology, art, engineering and maths). It encourages children to take an independent enquiry-based approach towards their learning. There are different levels of the award. KS1 children have achieved their Star Award and KS2 children have achieved their Superstar Award. All of the children have enjoyed completing the challenges and improving their understanding of STEAM subjects through hands-on learning and enquiry. As a school, we recognise the importance of the STEAM subjects as those that will help inspire our future: scientists, engineers and mathematicians as well as many more careers.
