Class of the Week Year 5

This week we have been very busy. On Monday, we took part in our Orienteering launch and used our control marker map to complete a quiz in our house groups. It was great fun and we enjoyed representing different explorers around the world such as Amelia Earhart and Neil Armstrong.

In science, we have been learning about the moon and how craters are formed upon it. We wanted to find out what affected the size of the craters caused by meteors. First, we used flour and cocoa powder to create the moons surface. We then used a measuring stick to drop a marble (meteor) from different heights. We then measured the size of the crater made and analysed our results. We found our that the higher the drop of the marble, the bigger crater was made.

In music, we have been rehearsing and learning about a Nasheed themed song called 'Madina, Madina.' We have sung in rounds and echoes.
