Lenten Appeal

Lent is a time for fasting, prayer, and giving. It's a time for us to reflect on our lives while living each day through Christ. There are three Pillars to guide us through Lent: Almsgiving, Fasting, and Prayer. Each of these are important to help us live through Christ each day. Throughout Lent, we will continue to have additional times of prayer and worship, including opening up our school chapel at morning drop off to invite families to start their day with prayer.

Today, the children have taken home Catholic Children's Society money boxes. We ask that families donate what they can during Lent to help support the pillars of fasting and alms-giving. Perhaps children may chose to donate some pocket money; or by giving up things like fizzy drinks or sweets, they could put that money into their collection box
