## <u>Year 6 SATs</u>

The children in our Year 6 class and across the country, will be taking their SATs (Statutory Assessment Tests) next week. The tests will take place during Monday to Thursday mornings in school. The completed papers are sent away to be marked externally. The children's results are sent back to school at some point in July, parents and carers will be informed of your child's results in their end of year report. The mental wellbeing of our children is of the utmost importance throughout the entire school year, however during the SATs period we have focused particularly on the wellbeing of the children. The children have been well supported and are prepared and ready for these assessments. I am very proud of all of their efforts and I am sure they will be proud of their achievements. A positive attitude goes a long way, give them as much support and encouragement as you can.

We ask that like everyday, the children arrive on time to avoid a delay in the start time for all children and of course they will need to bring a filled water bottle. Please do not hesitate to contact the Year 6 email if you have any questions.

The standard timings of tests differ but last no more than 60 minutes:

Monday 9th May—Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (Paper 1)

Monday 9th May—Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (Paper 2)

Tuesday 10th May—Reading

Wednesday 11th May—Maths Paper 1 (Arithmetic)

Wednesday 11th May—Maths Paper 2 (Reasoning)

Thursday 12th May—Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning)
